

**Fraud Alert – 8/26/2009**



**August 25, 2009, Alexandria, Va.** – The National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) is alerting all federally insured credit unions about a fraudulent Letter to Credit Unions.

**Letter Claiming to Be From the NCUA**

**August 25, 2009, Alexandria, Va.** – The National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) is alerting all federally insured credit unions about a fraudulent Letter to Credit Unions. A federally insured credit union has reported receiving a bogus Letter to Credit Unions, accompanied by two compact discs (CDs). The subject of the fraudulent letter itself is a purported NCUA FRAUD Alert. The letter advises credit unions to review training material (contained on the CDs). **DOING SO COULD RESULT IN A POSSIBLE SECURITY BREACH TO YOUR COMPUTER SYSTEM, OR HAVE OTHER ADVERSE CONSEQUENCES.**
